

Enoxaparin Sodium Injection IP

Enoxaparin is used to prevent blood clots in the log in patients who are on bedcast or who are having hip replacement, knee replacement, or stomach surgery. It is used in combination with aspirin to prevent complications from angina (chest pain) and heart attacks.

INDICATIONS:

- Treatment of blood clots that travel to the lungs (pulmonary emboism).
- Treating blood clots in the coronary arteries in unstable angina and heart attack (myocardial infarction)
- Preventing these types of blood clots (thromboembolic disorders), particularly following general surgery of surgery on the bones (orthopaedic surgery), or in people bedridden due to illness
- Treatment of blood clots in the veins of the leg (deep vein thrombosis).
- Preventing blood from clotting when it is filtered through an "artificial kidney" (haemodialysis) machine as part of the management of kidney failure.
